3. **Declaration of Interests:** Cllr. Hulme is a member of the SMDC Planning Committee.
4. **Public Participation:** A resident wanted to thank the council on the new Cheadle Road improvements, however, pointed out the footpath clearing has not continued to its natural end, which is further up the road towards Brookside.

6. **Matters Arising:**

- a) **Update on Cheadle Road: Work is still in progress**, some snagging issues that have been passed on to relevant departments.

A vehicle has backed up against a road sign pole outside Villa Verdi. Clerk to report.

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- b) **Update on Planters and Bedding Plants:** Clerk reported that Sweet Meadows are happy to continue with bedding plants in the new planters. Lengths-person to send a quote to the council for the final two planters.

Breach Lane survey: No further news on this issue.

7. District Council Report: No District report due to absence.

8. County Councillor Report:

- Cllr. Bentley updated the council on the roadworks on Cheadle Road, the railings on the corner of Cheadle Road have been repaired and painted during the temporary road closure, the footpath has been cleared, although he will chase up why not further up the road. Cllr also reports the ditches have been cleared satisfactory and confirmed that the land behind the Bus shelter is Parish Councils.
- Cllr. Bentley has reported that unfortunately he has not had any further response after his latest email regarding the Crossing, there has been a further two accidents on the same road since last meeting and Cllr Bentley requested the Clerk email him regarding further information so he can forward to relevant people.
- Cllr Bentley also noted that the Grass on the entrance to the A50 roundabout will need early cutting, as it can block visibility, making it very dangerous, both Cllr. Bentley and Clerk will endeavour to find out how to do this with relevant authorities

Projects in Progress

Highways

- i. **Crossing or Pedestrian refuge on Uttoxeter Road.** No further progress on this issue as a third survey is being done on the road.

The Clerk will keep the council informed of any information received.

- ii. **VAS** – The Council agreed that both existing signs should be relocated and erected in Cresswell. The Clerk and councillors were scheduled to meet with Highways Officer Aron Brown to confirm the proposed locations; however, we have since been informed that he has left his position and moved to another council. The Clerk will follow this up with the newly appointed Highways Officer. In addition, there have been reports that a county-wide requirement may be introduced for all VAS equipment to use the same camera system. This matter will also be investigated and clarified.

- iii. **Community Speedwatch:** Councillors will continue to chase and update on any progress.

Projects

Totmonslow Sign: The Totmonslow sign on Draycott Road at the Tean entrance is still down, Clerk is still applying to the Moorlands Partnership Board for restoration of heritage features, with the Clerk still to seek quotations for a design and two new signs, consult with Highways officer and to apply for the MPB grant from SMDC.

Village Gateways: Site visit still to be arranged to discuss locations and written permission, hopefully the same time as meeting regarding the VAS Cameras.

Bus Stop Art Galleries:

The Clerk has printed 50 old photographs that need to be displayed. Project still ongoing.

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Parish Information welcome Cards: Thanks was given to Cllr. Deaville who has had 30 cards printed, which he is donating to the Parish Council. Cllr. Reardon is putting together a list of helpful numbers and advice that will be going into the cards welcoming new parishioners.

Communication

- I. **Policies:** Clerk to investigate a new safeguarding policy for all to complete.
- II. **Calendar of events 2026:** Remembrance Sunday – It was agreed that the Remembrance Sunday displays in the bus shelters were very well received by residents, and that the silhouettes displayed at the memorial were a fitting addition to the commemorations, will need to take inventory of the poppies so that extra can be acquired. The Christmas lights at the Bus shelters looked great and again we may need to take inventory. Both initiatives should be included in the 2026 Calendar of Events. Details and arrangements will be confirmed in due course.
- III. **Training and Development** – The Clerk has successfully completed the first stage of training and requested approval to enrol on the next finance training course provided by SPCA. Approval was granted, proposed by Cllr. Deaville and seconded by Cllr. Birds.
